St. major). Courses with the same prefix as the primary major may fit as advised electives or as major courses (e.g. ENV 304 for a Bio/Env. major).
- **Substitutions** for any of the courses listed above must be approved by the program coordinator. Refer to the Niagara University Catalog for the most up-to-date listing.
- The **capstone** course in the chosen major should, if possible, involve an environmentally-related topic. Also, students are encouraged to consider a cooperative education or internship experience in a government agency, interest group or business concerned with environmental issues.
