2019-Literacy 36.36% (n=11), Special Education 35.29% (n=34), TESOL 62.5% (n=8), School Counselor 43.75% (n=3), School Psychology 50.00% (n=8), Educational Leadership 50.85% (n=59)

2020-Literacy 46.67% (n=15), Special Education 34.48% (n=58), TESOL 33.33% (n=6), School Counselor 64.29% (n=14), School Psychology 42.86% (n=7), Educational Leadership 55.17% (n=29)

2021-Literacy 18.75% (n=16), Special Education 25.81% (n=31), TESOL 33.33% (n=3), School Counselor 20% (n=5), School Psychology no data, Educational Leadership 35.31% (n=71)

2018 summary. One year after graduation 100% of advanced program completers were either employed or in graduate school or both.

2019 summary. One year after graduation all advanced program completers seeking employment, except 2 were employed. Average starting salaries appear to have increased over the prior year. Fewer candidates were continuing education following program completion.

2020 summary. One year after graduation all advanced program completers seeking employment, except 1 were employed. Average starting salaries appear to have increased over the prior year. Slightly more candidates were continuing education following program completion.
