## Father Maher's Message in Response to the Supreme Court Decision on Using Race as a Factor in College Admissions

And although this decision was rendered in direct response to practices at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and Harvard University, it can dramatically change how the nation's public and private colleges determine which students to admit.

We know the value of a college education and we know that access to a quality college education is still difficult for many. As we move forward, it is critical that we follow the words of Justice Sonia Sotomayor, who wrote in her dissenting opinion, "The pursuit of racial diversity will go on. We will study this ruling and ensure that we continue to comply with the Court's decision. We will also continue to build diverse working and learning environments that benefit all individuals.
