Father Maher's Reflections on the War in Ukraine Feb. 23, 2024

"Let us continue our help and intensify prayer, especially to ask for the gift of peace in the world." — Pope Francis

This weekend marks two years since the Russian invasion of Ukraine, beginning the largest attack on a European country since World War II. Since Feb. 24, 2022, more than 10,000 civilians have lost their lives in this senseless conflict.
