Quick Start Guide for Students

This Quick Start guide will walk you through the process of logging in to Canvas and submitting your work. If you do not know your login information for Canvas, please contact your local Administrator for assistance.


Step 1: Log into Your Canvas Account

Enter your Username and Password (Purple Pass credentials) 2.
 Click Log In.

Step 2: Access Anthology through the Canvas menu bar

(purple area) on left side of screen and enter your Purple Pass credentials (see figure below). Sometimes the Anthology option/logo does not appear and a blank space is shown. If this occurs, click on the blank space and Anthology should appear.


Note: If your Anthology account has not been setup you will get an error message asking for a subscription code. Please contact your Anthology administer on Campus for assistance.




Step 3: Create a Portfolio


First time users will need to agree to the terms and conditions prior to gaining access. You may even be asked to change password if it was recently reset. You will then be directed to the Dashboard screen. Here you can view information regarding your account. To submit work for assessment, you will need to create a portfolio (if you have not done so already). Before you create a portfolio or submit additional work within an existing portfolio you should be aware of the "Table of Contents" and/or "Department" aligned with the submission you need to make. The "Table of Contents" outlines and organizes the work that needs to be submitted for a given program or course. If you do not select the correct "Table of Contents" you will not know where to place your work within the portfolio and you will not be able to submit your work for evaluation. For example: If you are in the undergraduate program for education, you would select the "Undergraduate Phase I Program Portfolio" to get started. Do Not manually create your own course to submit an assignment as it will not be attached to a table of contents and will not allow you to select a professor's name. Only add portfolios to your account as guided below.

To access an existing portfolio or create a new one, go to the icon located in the black area on the left side of screen, and select the 'Work' menu option.







On the Work Menu screen, select "My Coursework."




If you have already created a portfolio for your program and/or specialty area, select the portfolio you would like to work on.




Select "edit" portfolio




To create a new portfolio, select the 'New Portfolio' button located near the top of the section.




Enter a **name** for your portfolio. It is recommended to name the portfolio the same as what was selected from the dropdown menu. For example: Undergraduate Phase I Program Portfolio



Select the **Table of Contents** for your program of study and/or specialty area.




If your program of study is not listed, click on the "Can't find your Table of Contents?" Link



Additional drop-down selections will appear.

- 1. Select Department = All Departments
- 2. Select Table of Contents = Your program of study




Be sure to select the appropriate Table of Contents for your program and submission requirements. If you are unsure, you may ask for guidance from your advisor, professor, or Anthology administrator on Campus.


Click 'Create' and you will see a table of contents appear with courses listed. If you do not see your course as an option, you may have added either an incorrect portfolio or your course is located in another portfolio. You will need to select another option from the dropdown menu.

Step 4: Adding Content to your Portfolio.


Select the appropriate **section for your course/assignment/program requirement** from the options listed in your table of contents.




To submit your work, you must add content to the portfolio page first. Select "Add Content"




Various types of content can be added to your portfolio, including text, files (documents, images, videos, etc.), forms and internal links.




There are many ways to add content to your portfolio; the most common way is by selecting option # 2: *Add File*. After uploading your files, go to the submit your work section. If an error message appears due to the size of your file upload. You will need to compress the file and/or remove some of the content in order for your upload to be successful. You can search the internet for the best way to compress your file according to the type of computer software you are using.



Click on *Choose Files* and upload your assignment(s). You will see the file(s) appear on the bottom of the page. You will now need to **insert your file** prior to submitting the assignment.



To insert a file, click on *Insert Files* (top right of the box). Once files are inserted, the **Submit button** will be enabled (turns green).




Option 1: Use the function *Text Block* to copy and paste work into the portfolio or to compose work directly in the portfolio.

If you wish to **copy content from any other source** and paste it into the text editor, simply place your cursor in the text editor and use "Ctrl + V" (PC) or "Command + V" (MAC) to paste your content. You may now have to format your text using the tools available from the text editor. *Option 3*: Use the function *Files from My Library* if you have previously uploaded your work to the Artifact Library or to a portfolio.

Option 4: Use the function *Add Form* if you have been instructed to attach a form to your portfolio page and complete it. Use the function **Internal Link** to create a link to another section of your portfolio.

Step 5: Submit your Assignment.

Once you have added your work to the portfolio page and close it, the Submit button will become enabled. To submit your work for assessment, click 'Submit'. Note: If multiple documents need to be submitted for a single requirement, do not submit the work until all items have been added into the portfolio.



Type the name of the assessor that you wish to submit to, in the 'Assessor' text box. The name should auto-complete as long as the assessor is in the system and is in the correct department. When the correct name is shown, click on it to select it.


Once you have selected the assessor, click 'Submit'.

Note: If you cannot locate the correct assessor on the Submit screen, contact the Anthology administrator at the University for guidance and direction. You may also want to email the assignment directly to your professor in order to not miss any deadlines until this issue is resolved and you are able to upload and submit successfully.

A message will appear to indicate that your content has been submitted.

Click on the **Review Submission** button if you would like to review the submission that you just made.


If you do not see the "Content Submitted" message, or the "Status: Submitted" flag, your content has not been submitted.



Step 6: View Results


Once your submissions have been assessed and the results made available to you, you can access and view them from the **My Results** screen. To access the My Results screen:

- 1. Click on the Main Menu Icon.
- 2. Click on the Work option.







3. Select My Results.



4. If your submission has already been assessed, its score will appear in the **Score** column. If not, the score will be listed as pending until your assessor reviews and completes your submission.



- **5.** If you wish to view the assessment details, including feedback comments and individual rubric criterion scores, click anywhere on the row for the submission.
- **6.** When you see the pop-up menu, select the **View Summary** or **View Details** option. If you wish to view the work that you submitted, select the **Work** option. If you would like to view more information about your assessor, or send them a message, select **View Assessor Info**.
